Her research focuses on understanding the occurrence and treatment of emerging water contaminants and water quality monitoring relevant to water and wastewater utilities and regulatory agencies. She also engages with mentoring and teaching undergraduate and K-12 students.

Her cross-cutting work focuses on technical assistance for the public sector.
